Township Planner Per Lundberg announced that the Township of Selwyn is holding a public meeting to consider a municipally initiated amendment to the Township Comprehensive Zoning By-law in accordance with Section 34 of The Planning Act. The prescribed notice of the public meeting was provided in the Peterborough Examiner. The notice was also provided to the prescribed ministries and agencies via email and was also available on the Township website. If a person or public body does not make an oral submission at the public meeting or make a written submission to the Township of Selwyn before the Comprehensive Zoning By-law is passed the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision of the Council of the Township of Selwyn to the Ontario Land Tribunal, nor can a person or public body be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to do so. In order to be notified of the decision of the Township of Selwyn on the proposed Zoning By-law Amendment, a written request must be made to the Township.

A public meeting commenced at 5:54 PM to amend the Township's Comprehensive Zoning By-law in accordance with Section 34 of The Planning Act. Mr. Lundberg noted that housekeeping amendments to the Comprehensive Zoning By-law are intended to be technical amendments to provide clarity and ease administrative burden. It was also noted that no new zone categories or changes to the permitted uses within any zone category were proposed. Additionally, no changes to the zoning schedule 'A' of the Township's Comprehensive Zoning Bylaw No. 2009-021, as amended, affecting the zoning of properties in the Township are proposed. Mr. Lundberg brought forward that given the technical nature of the amendments, the amendments will not affect the consistency and conformity of the Township's Comprehensive Zoning By-law No. 2009-021, as amended, with the Provincial Policy Statement (PPS), Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe, County Official Plan and the Local Component of the County Official Plan (i.e. the Township's Official Plan) as required by the Planning Act. No one registered to speak in favour or in opposition to the proposed amendment. Council members asked a number of questions pertaining to the amendment. There were no members of the public in attendance virtually. The public meeting concluded at 6:01 PM.

Whereas Gypsy Moths (Lymantria dispar) is a defined as a pest because the caterpillars have various appetites for more than 300 species of trees and shrubs, which results in the caterpillars defoliating trees leaving them vulnerable to disease which can eventually kill the tree; and

Whereas the gypsy moths have been present in areas of the Township of Selwyn; and

Whereas Hon. Greg Rickford, Ontario Minister of Northern Development, Mines, Natural Resources and Forestry, made a commitment at the ROMA 2022 Conference Ministers Forum that his Ministry was looking at mitigation measures to deal with the problem and would spray where needed;

Therefore be it resolved, that a letter be sent to Hon. Greg Rickford to advise that Selwyn Township be added to the list for areas to be sprayed or use other removal methods to deal with Gypsy Moths, once the Ministry assessment is complete and that a copy of this Resolution be sent to MPP David Smith, the other townships in Peterborough County and to the County of Peterborough.
